



## **School Uniform Policy**

The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) is at the heart of our school's planning, policies, practice and ethos. As a rights-respecting school we not only teach about children's rights but also model rights and respect in all relationships.

### **School Uniform**

The school has an official uniform and it is expected that every child wears this uniform. Uniforms are available at Picton Sports in Llanelli or on their website:

- A grey jumper emblazoned with the school logo
- A red polo shirt emblazoned with the school logo
- A grey skirt or grey trousers
- White, grey or black socks
- Black or dark sensible shoes (not trainers).

### **Summer Uniform**

#### **Girls**

- Red and white striped cotton dresses or dresses with a square pattern that are available in shops all over the country, and sensible shoes (i.e. no open sandals or flip flops - for health and safety reasons).
- A grey cardigan emblazoned with the school logo

#### **Boys**

- Short grey trousers or light shorts.

**\*\*We ask kindly that every pupil has a READING BAG as opposed to a big bag because of a lack of storage space.**

### **Gym Kit**

Short trousers and a team t-shirt (red/yellow/blue/green) for inside activities, a tracksuit and trainers for outdoor activities and a swimming costume for years 3 and 4.

The child's name should be written clearly on every piece of clothing, including trainers.

### **Swimming Lessons**

Children walk back to school after their swimming lessons, so if you do not wish for them to walk back to school with wet hair, they must wear a swimming cap. There is no time for 30 children to use one hair dryer because other areas of the curriculum must be taught as well.

## **Jewellery**

For health and safety reasons, and because jewellery is unsuitable as school uniform, we do not allow children to wear jewellery to school. In line with the Local Education Authority's guidelines, every piece of jewellery must be removed during gym lessons and other practical lessons. If your child has brought jewellery to school, the jewellery is their responsibility at all times.

If your child wants earrings, please ensure that they have their ears pierced at the beginning of the summer holidays so that they have the six weeks needed before they return to school in September.

Physical activity is an important part of the curriculum, so please ensure that your child does not wear any jewellery that they are unable to remove on these days.

Nail varnish should not be worn on the nails when in school.

## **Hair**

Hair should be kept tidy. We do not accept extreme hair styles.

Hair should be kept back from their face and eyes and if it is long, it should be tied in a bobble.
